

A Study on Factors Influencing Parents Decision in Sending Their Children to Private Schools with Special Reference to North Coimbatore

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ABSTRACT

The project titled "A study on factors influencing parents' decision in sending their children to private schools with special reference to North Coimbatore" is done to analyze the parent preference in sending their children to private school. The objective of the study is to identify the factors influencing parent's decision in choosing private schools for their Children.

Descriptive research design is used in this study which involves gathering data that describes the events and then organizes, tabulates, depicts and describes the data collection. The study is conducted in the North region of Coimbatore city. Data is collected from 176 respondents using Google survey form. Convenience sampling under non-probability probability method is used to collect the data from the respondents. Collected data is analyzed through SPSS software using Descriptives, Chi-square and Factor analysis. Based on the result, it is concluded that Annual income of the parents has impact on various facilities provided to the children in their school. Major factors like quality of teaching, Communication of the children, extra-curricular activities, transportation facility and advanced technologies provided by the school influences parental decision in sending their children to private school.

I. ABOUT THE STUDY

An independent school is autonomous in its finance and governance. These are also known as private schools, non-governmental, privately funded or non-state schools that are not administered

by local, state or national government. In British English, an independent school usually refers to a school that is furnished i.e., held by a trust, charity or foundation although a private school is one that is privately owned.

Private school curriculum is set by the individual school management, unlike public schools, that are subject to strict curriculum guidelines developed by the state government. Though the majority of private schools are free to teach their own curriculum of their choice, they're still dependent on the basic educational requirements set on by their local Department of Education. These requirements differ from one state to another state, but they generally include health and safety welfare measures to protect the well-being of students like regulations on transportation, food handling, employee conduct and record-keeping.

Various factors that influence the parents' choice in selection of school for their children are as follows:

- Social Background and Status
- School Syllabus
- School Environment and Facilities
- School Performance
- Quality of Education
- Location of the school

OBJECTIVE OF THE STUDY

- To identify the factors influencing parent's decision in choosing private schools for their children.

II. REVIEW OF LITERATURE

- NA Yaacob, MM Osman, S Bachok (2014) in their work titled “Factors influencing parent’s decision in choosing private schools” found that parents lay stress on the importance of syllabus, environment and facilities provided by the school when selecting to enrol their children in private schools.
- Alsaudi and Faisal (2015) in their work titled “Effect of the School Facilities Factor and Sport Activities Factor on Parents in Terms of Private and Public School Choice at Riyadh City Saudi Arabia” highlighted two study factors regarding the selection of school for their children school facilities and the advanced technology provided by the school.
- F Alsaudi (2016) in his work titled “Reasons Influencing Selection Decision Making of Parental Choice of School” identified three elements that are classified from the academic factor that highly influences parental decision making in selection of school for their children: class size, quality of instruction and student/teacher relationship.
- D Warmbier (2018) in his work titled “A

correlational study of factors that contribute to private school enrolment: School Culture and Physical Facilities” particularly considered the two factors: the condition of the physical facilities provided by the school and the culture and climate of the school.

- YR Subedi (2021) in his work titled “Factors Affecting Parental Choice of Private and Public Schools in Dhading” concluded that class size is the strongest factor. The second strong factor was favourable environment for their children and the final influencing factor of parental choice was identified as School Facilities.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Research design: Descriptive research design

Sample size: 176

Sampling method: Convenience sampling under non-probability sampling Primary data: Questionnaire method

Secondary data: Journals, books, reports and publications

Statistical tools used for analysis: Descriptives, Chi-Square analysis, Factor analysis

From the above table it is found that, annual income has no impact on the social status of the parents, Indoor and outdoor games are provided to the child and favorable environment provided for the learning and annual income of the parents has

impact on the class size and extra coaching provided to the children. Syllabus of the children has no impact on Activity based learning and outdoor teaching organized for the children and has impact on the advanced technology provided to the child.

Kaiser Meyer Olkin measure is an index which defines the sampling adequacy. The KMO test value is 0.685 which is more than 0.5, so it is considered to be acceptable and valid to conduct

data reduction technique.

Bartlett's test of Sphericity significant of a level of significance is <0.001 which shows that there is a high level of correlation between variables, which make it adequate to apply factor analysis.

IV. FINDINGS

- 50.6% of the parents are Graduate, 42.6% of the parents earns Rs 2,00,000-Rs 5,00,000 per annum and 47.7% of the parents prefer CBSE syllabus for their children.
- Annual income has no impact on the social status of the parents, Indoor and outdoor games are provided to the child and favorable environment provided for the learning and annual income of the parents has impact on the class size and extra coaching provided to the children.
- Syllabus of the Child has impact on the Advanced technology provided to the child and has no impact on Activity based learning and outdoor teaching organized for the child.
- Major factors which influence the parents’ decision in choosing private school for their children are extra-curricular activity provided to the children, communication of the children, advanced technology used for teaching, transportation facility provided to the children and environment provided for learning.

V. SUGGESTIONS

- Social emotional skills can be taught to the children so that they’ll have self-control, have

- positive self-image and be kind towards others.
- School fee can be reduced so that many parents can afford for their child’s better education in the that provides various facilities.
- Working hour of the school can be reduced so that child feels relaxed and their physical and mental will be healthy.
- Parents can prefer syllabus and school based on their economic background so that their family relationship remains stronger.

VI. CONCLUSION

The study set out to identify why parents choose a certain private institution over other institutions. It was not intended to identify why they choose private institutions over public institutions and the study set out to define what the competitive advantage is of a certain private education institution. This will then enable the institution to be able to define what sets the institution apart from its competitors.

Based on the study conducted in Coimbatore North region from the data collected from 176 respondents, it is found that parents prefer CBSE for their child’s education. It is concluded that various factors like facilities provided by the school, extra-curricular activities and extra coaching offered to the children, reputation of the school, quality of teaching and output of the child influences the parent’s decision in choosing school for their child.

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
